TOWN OF DECATUR GREEN COUNTY, WISCONSIN

Ordinance Prohibiting Application of Liquid Animal Manures Using Center Pivot Irrigation Systems

RECITALS

- A. According to studies including, but without limitation, Application of Liquid Animal Manures Using Center Pivot Irrigation Systems published by the University of Nebraska-Lincoln Extension, the application of manure by center pivot manure distribution systems offers a large potential for significant odor release during short periods of time.
- B. The use of center pivot irrigation systems for spreading manure has not been extensively used in the State of Wisconsin, but it has been proposed for use by certain producers.
- C. A memorandum prepared by Robert Thiboldeaux, a toxicologist for the Wisconsin Division of Public Health, raises the potential for substantial health concerns resulting from the land application of liquid manure using center pivot sprinkler technology.
- D. The Town Board of the Town of Decatur has power under Village Powers pursuant to Wis. Stat. 60.22(3), to enact ordinances defining and prohibiting public nuisances.
- E. The Town Board of the Town of Decatur believes that prohibiting the use of center pivot manure distribution systems will reduce the potential for creation of offensive and unhealthful odors and disease created by such systems.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the findings, the town board of the Town of Decatur, Green County does hereby ordain the following:

Section 1 - PROHIBITION OF CENTER PIVOT MANURE DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM

SUBSECTION A: Public Nuisance

The use of all center pivot manure distribution system is hereby declared to be a public nuisance and the use of Center Pivot Manure Distribution Systems is strictly prohibited within the Town of Decatur. For purposes of this section "center pivot manure distribution system" refers to a system for spreading manure that involves spreading the manure in liquid form through nozzles attached to a pivoting arm located in a farm field.

SUBSECTION B: Enforcement

This Ordinance shall be enforced pursuant of the Town of Decatur Ordinance Chapter 12 Section 6 Public Nuisances.

Section 2 - ABROGATION AND GREATER RESTRICTIONS

It is not intended by this Ordinance to repeal, abrogate, annul, impair or interfere with any existing easements, covenants, deed restrictions, agreements, ordinances, rules, regulations, or permits previously adopted or issued pursuant to law. However, when this Ordinance imposes greater restrictions, the provision of the Ordinance shall govern.

Section 3-INTERPRETATION

In its interpretation and application, the provisions of this Ordinance shall be liberally construed in favor of the Town and shall not be construed to be a limitation or repeal of any other power granted by the Wisconsin Statutes except as expressly set forth herein.
